The K-12 Leadership and Higher Education Administration concentrations allow participants to develop expertise in specific settings and issues. The program will also engage students, faculty, and other members of the education community in integrated inquiry into issues that span our educational systems. This unique combination of deep understanding, expanded vision, and diverse professional networks positions participants for innovative, entrepreneurial leadership in a complex and changing world.

Two Distinct Concentrations with an Integrated Perspective

K-12 Leadership prepares educators who want to be leaders where they work- in the classroom, in administration, in student support and guidance offices, and in policy positions- in order to assist students in becoming effective global citizens and guide the development of future educational programs and systems.

Higher Education Administration provides college and university administrators, faculty, and higher education policy makers with the understanding of organizational theory, innovative practice, and change management necessary to lead in diverse institutions and functional areas.

Together we will explore connections between K-12 and Higher Education Administration in the areas of retention, access, and organizational change/reform.

Admission Requirements:

- Master's degree required with a minimum GPA of 3.0.
- A minimum of 3-5 years professional experience in the field of education or higher education.
- Admission is selective with a limit of 10-12 students in each concentration.
- No standardized tests required.

Review of applications begins December 1st and will continue until April 1st. Applications received after April 1st will be considered if space is available in the cohort. Interview with the Program Director or a member of the program faculty is required. We will contact you after the application materials are received.

Submit:

1. Application form completed and signed.
2. Application fee of \$35 in check or money order made payable to New England College.
3. Please provide a current resume that includes but is not limited to the areas listed below:
 - Education: Major(s), schools attended, degrees obtained and dates of attendance;
 - Professional positions held;
 - Presentations made to organizations, groups and professional associations;
 - Honors/awards received;
 - Memberships in professional and other organizations;
 - Community Service: Name(s) of organizations, description of activities and positions held.
4. Official transcripts from all previous post-secondary institutions other than NEC.
5. Two letters of recommendation which attest to your professional ability as well as your qualifications for the Doctorate of Education.
6. Please submit a 1000-1500 word personal statement which outlines your professional goals, any background and experiences that have led to your decision to pursue a doctorate, and how the doctorate will help you achieve those goals.
7. Transfer credit: Due to the accelerated, cohort-based structure of the program, transfer of credits is not encouraged. Requests for transfer of post-master's credits will be evaluated on a case-by-case basis for alignment with program content and learning outcomes.

Admission to New England College's Doctorate of Education is selective; the College takes into consideration all aspects of the applicant's background and abilities, including professional experience, writing skills, and other accomplishments relevant to the program of study.
